

Al Act compliance checks

a. Introductory text

The AI Act is the world's first comprehensive law regulating the development, provision, and use of AI. A quick check can help you stay compliant in time and maintain your competitive edge.

b. Checklist: are you in scope?

Answer "yes" or "no":

- Do you develop, make, train, or import AI software or systems?
- ▶ Do you deploy AI tools in your business or sell AI-powered products/services?
- ▶ Do you offer AI products or services to people or companies in the EU?
- ▶ Do you use AI in areas like biometric identification, critical infrastructure, education, employment, or law enforcement?
- Do you use AI that makes automatic decisions affecting people's safety, rights, or access to services?
- Does your AI analyse emotions, predict behavior or manipulate people?
- Do you use general-purpose AI models (like ChatGPT) or foundation models in your business?

High likelihood you fall under the AI Act.	Moderate likelihood - probably have some obligations.	Low current risk but monitor supply chain exposure.
Tip: Urgent compliance action required - identify your risk category (prohibited, high-risk, transparancy risk), conduct risk assessments, and establish governance systems. Non-compliance can result in fines up to €35 million or 7% of global turnover.	Tip: Determine your exact role (importer, provider, deployer, distributor or user) and specific requirements. Prepare documentation systems and ensure AI literacy training. Some violations can still trigger significant penalties.	Tip: Review AI use by suppliers/ vendors, integrate AI governance into procurement policies, and stay informed about evolving enforcement. Indirect exposure through business partners is possible.
